

GRADUATE STUDIES: Environmental Litigation

This new course explores both the theory and practice of environmental litigation in Australia.

It not only examines the full spectrum of environmental litigation including merits appeals and judicial review but also explores the place of litigation within an effective environmental regulatory system.

The course should be of particular interest to practising lawyers, whether in government agencies and departments, private practice or community legal centres.

The course can either be done as part of a degree, as a single subject or as a professional development short course.

It will be taught by the Queensland barrister, Dr Chris McGrath, who has not only appeared in many of Australia's leading environmental cases over the last few years but also has published very extensively on Australian environmental law.
